NOTICE OF PROHIBITION

WHEREAS on or about July 7, 2015, Linda Sue Newcomb ("Newcomb") was sentenced on the charges of Embezzlement of Credit Union Funds, 18 U.S.C. § 657, and Bank Fraud, 18 U.S.C. § 1344, charges to which she had previously pleaded guilty, in connection with her employment at Lynrocten Federal Credit Union, in the United States District Court for the Western District of Virginia;

WHEREAS violations of 18 U.S.C. § 657 and 18 U.S.C. § 1344 are criminal offenses involving dishonesty and breach of trust;

NOW, THEREFORE, YOU ARE HEREBY NOTIFIED THAT:

1. Pursuant to 12 U.S. C. § 1785(d)(1)(A) and 12 U.S.C. § 1829(a)(1)(A), Newcomb is prohibited from becoming an "institution affiliated party" of any insured depository institution, as defined in 12 U.S.C. § 1786(r); otherwise participating, directly or indirectly, in the conduct of the affairs of any insured depository institution; and owning or controlling, directly or indirectly, any insured depository institution;

2. Pursuant to 12 U.S. C. § 1785(d)(1)(B) and 12 U.S.C. § 1829(a)(1)(B), no insured depository institution may permit Newcomb to engage in any conduct or continue in any relationship prohibited in paragraph 1 above;

3. Pursuant to 12 U.S.C. § 1785(d)(3) and 12 U.S.C. § 1829(b), whoever knowingly violates paragraph 1 or 2 above is subject to a fine of not more than \$1 million for each day such prohibition is violated, or imprisonment for not more than five (5) years, or both;

4. The "Amended Judgment in a Criminal Case" document, Case No.

DVAW614CR000009-001, is made a part hereof and is incorporated herein by reference; and

5. This Notice of Prohibition shall be effective and enforceable on the date set forth below.

SUPERVISED RELEASE

Upon release from imprisonment, the defendant shall be on supervised release for a term of:

5 years (This term consists of terms of 5 years on each of Counts 1, 4, and 5, and 1 year on Count 7, all such terms to run concurrently.)

The defendant must report to the probation office in the district to which the defendant is released within 72 hours of release from the custody of the Bureau of Prisons.

The defendant shall not commit another federal, state or local crime.

The defendant shall not unlawfully possess a controlled substance. The defendant shall refrain from any unlawful use of a controlled substance. The defendant shall submit to one drug test within 15 days of release from imprisonment and at least two periodic drug tests thereafter, as determined by the court.

- The above drug testing condition is suspended, based on the court's determination that the defendant poses a low risk of future substance abuse. (Check, if applicable.)
- The defendant shall not possess a firearm, ammunition, destructive device, or any other dangerous weapon. (Check, if applicable.)

- the defendant shall not associate with any persons engaged in criminal activity and shall not associate with any person convicted of a felony, unless granted permission to do so by the probation officer;
- 10) the defendant shall permit a probation officer to visit him or her at any time at home or elsewhere and shall permit confiscation of any contraband observed in plain view of the probation officer;
- the defendant shall notify the probation officer within seventy-two hours of being arrested or questioned by a law enforcement officer; Π)
