NOTICE OF PROHIBITION

WHEREAS on or about December 19, 2012, Georgia Schwartz ("Schwartz") was adjudged guilty of Embezzlement and Misapplication from a Credit Union, 18 U.S.C. § 657 in the United States District Court for the District of North Dakota, in connection with her employment at Glen Ullin Credit Union;

WHEREAS a violation of 18 U.S.C. §§ 657 is a criminal offense involving dishonesty and breach of trust;

NOW, THEREFORE, YOU ARE HEREBY NOTIFIED THAT:

1. Pursuant to 12 U.S. C. § 1785(d)(1)(A) and 12 U.S.C. § 1829(a)(1)(A), Schwartz is prohibited from becoming an "institution affiliated party" of any insured depository institution, as defined in 12 U.S.C. § 1786(r); otherwise participating, directly or indirectly, in the conduct of the affairs of any insured depository institution; and owning or controlling, directly or indirectly, any insured depository institution;

- 2. Pursuant to 12 U.S. C. § 1785(d)(1)(B) and 12 U.S.C. § 1829(a)(1)(B), no insured depository institution may permit Schwartz to engage in any conduct or continue in any relationship prohibited in paragraph 1 above:
- 3. Pursuant to 12 U.S.C. § 1785(d)(3) and 12 U.S.C. § 1829(b), whoever knowingly violates paragraph 1 or 2 above is subject to a fine of not more than \$1 million for each day such prohibition is violated, or imprisonment for not more than five (5) years, or both;
- The "Judgment in a Criminal Case" document, case number 1:12-CR-082. is made a part hereof and is incorporated herein by reference; and
- 5. This Notice of Prohibition shall be effective and enforceable on the date set forth below.

SUPERVISED RELEASE

Upon release from imprisonment, the defendant shall be on supervised release for a term of 36 MONTHS.

The defendant must report to the probation office in the district to which the defendant is released within 72 hours of release from the custody of the Bureau of Prisons.

The defendant shall not commit another federal, state, or local crime.

The defendant shall not unlawfully possess a controlled substance. The defendant shall refrain from any unlawful use of a controlled substance. The defendant shall submit to one drug test within 15 days of release from imprisonment and at least two periodic drug tests thereafter, as directed by the court.

The defendant shall not possess a firearm, destructive device, or any other dangerous weapon.

The above drug testing condition is suspended based on the court's determination that the defendant poses a low risk of future substance abuse. (Check if applicable.)

The defendant has been convicted of an offense listed in the DNA Analysis Backlog Elimination Act of 2000 or the Justice for All Act of 2004. These acts require the defendant to cooperate in the collection of DNA as directed by the probation officer.

If this judgment imposes a fine or a restitution obligation, it is a condition of supervised release that the defendant pay in accordance with the Schedule of Payments set forth in the Criminal Monetary Penalties page of this judgment.

The defendant must comply with the standard conditions that have been adopted by this court as well as with any additional conditions on the attached page.

STANDARD CONDITIONS OF SUPERVISION

- the defendant shall not leave the ludicial district without permission of the court or probation officer;
- the defendant shall report to the probation officer in a manner and frequency directed by the court or probation officer; 2)
- the defendant shall answer truthfully all inquiries by the probation officer and follow instructions of the probation officer;
- the defendant shall support his or her dependants and meet other family responsibilities;
- the defendant shall work regularly at a lawful occupation unless excused by the probation officer for schooling, training or other acceptable reasons:
- the defendant shall notify the probation officer ten days prior to any change in residence or employment;
- the defendant shall refrain from excessive use of alcohol and shall not purchase, possess, use, distribute or administer any narcotic or other controlled substance, or any paraphernalia related to such substances;
- the defendant shall not frequent places where controlled substances are illegally sold, used, distributed, or administered;
- the defendant shall not associate with any persons engaged in criminal activity, and shall not associate with any person convicted of a felony unless granted permission to do so by the probation officer;
- 10) the defendant shall permit a probation officer to visit him or her at any time at home or elsewhere and shall permit confiscation of any contraband observed in plain view of the probation officer;
- 11) the defendant shall notify the probation officer within seventy-two hours of being arrested or questioned by a law enforcement officer;
- 12) the defendant shall not enter into any agreement to act as an informer or a special agent of a law enforcement agency without the permission of the court;
- as directed by the probation officer, the defendant shall notify third parties of risks that may be occasioned by the defendant's criminal record or personal history or characteristics, and shall permit the probation officer to make such notifications and to confirm the defendant's compliance with such notification requirement.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF SUPERVISION

- 1. The Defendant shall submit her person, residence, workplace, vehicle, computer, and/or possessions to a search conducted by a United States Probation Officer based upon evidence of a violation of a condition of supervision. Fallure to submit to search may be grounds for revocation, additional criminal charges, and arrest. The defendant shall notify any other residents that the premises may be subject to searches pursuant to this condition.
- 2. As directed by the Court, if during the period of supervised release the supervising probation officer determines the defendant is in need of placement in a Residential Re-Entry Center (RRC), the defendant shall voluntarily report to such a facility as directed by the supervising probation officer, cooperate with all rules and regulations of the facility, participate in all recommended programming, and not withdraw from the facility without prior permission of the supervising probation officer. The Court retains and exercises ultimate responsibility in this delegation of authority to the probation officer. See United States v. Kent, 209 F.3d 1073 (8th Cir. 2000).
- The Defendant shall be prohibited from opening any new lines of credit without the prior approval of the supervising probation officer.
- 4. The Defendant shall disclose her financial situation at the request of the supervising probation officer.

Upon a finding of a violation of probation or supervised release, I understand that the court may (1) revoke supervision, (2) extend the term of supervision, and/or (3) modify the conditions of supervision.
